**ORDER**

---

On July 7, 2014, Complainant Jessica Feller (“Feller”) filed a complaint with the Cook County Commission on Human Rights (“Commission”) against her former employer, Respondent Workright Occupational Health Services, S.C. (“Workright”), for discrimination related to her status as a pregnant woman taking maternity leave. The Commission has yet to determine whether there is substantial evidence to support a finding that Workright violated the Cook County Human Rights Ordinance, but on March 24, 2015, the Commission received a fully executed Withdrawal Request Form (“Request”) from Feller’s attorney.

Pursuant to the Commission’s Procedural Rules:

A Complainant may request to withdraw a Complaint or any part thereof at any time. A Complainant’s request to withdraw a Complaint shall be in writing and shall be signed by the Complainant or his/her attorney of record. Under such circumstances, the request may be presumed to be knowingly and voluntarily made, and the Commission may approve the request and enter an order dismissing the Complaint.

CCHR Pro. R. 420.160.

The Request, which was signed by Feller’s attorney of record, states that she “no longer wish[es] to pursue this Complaint.” Additionally, in the Request, Complainant attests that she is making her request to withdraw voluntarily and without pressure from any organization or individual.

For the foregoing reasons, the Commission hereby grants Feller’s request to withdraw her complaint and orders that Complaint No. 2014E012 be DISMISSED pursuant to a VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWAL.
