ORDER

On March 18, 2013 Complainant Sally Grover (“Grover”) filed a complaint against Murray L. Box (“Box”) and Loren Properties, Inc. (an Illinois corporation that is wholly-owned by Box), for discrimination in housing, based on her source of income (*i.e.* worker’s compensation and long-term disability Insurance benefits), in violation of the Cook County Human Rights Ordinance. The Cook County Commission on Human Rights (“Commission”) has not yet made an evidence determination with respect to this matter, but on July 7, 2014, the Commission received a fully executed Withdrawal Request Form (“Request”) from Grover after learning that Box had passed away.

Pursuant to the Commission’s Procedural Rules:

A Complainant may request to withdraw a Complaint or any part thereof at any time. A Complainant’s request to withdraw a Complaint shall be in writing and shall be signed by the Complainant or his/her attorney of record. Under such circumstances, the request may be presumed to be knowingly and voluntarily made, and the Commission may approve the request and enter an order dismissing the Complaint.



The Request, which was signed by Grover, states that she “no longer wish[es] to pursue this Complaint.” Grover also attests that she is making her request to withdraw voluntarily and without pressure from any organization or individual.

For the foregoing reasons, the Commission hereby grants Grover’s request to withdraw her complaint and orders that complaint 2013H001 be **DISMISSED** pursuant to a **VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWAL**.
