**ORDER**

On July 9, 2012 Complainant Shavonne Johnson (“Johnson”) filed a complaint against Howard Beauty Supply for unlawful retaliation and unlawful discrimination in employment, based on her race, parental status and marital status in violation of the Cook County Human Rights Ordinance. The Cook County Commission on Human Rights (“Commission”) has not yet made an evidence determination with respect to this matter, but on July 8, 2014, the Commission received a fully executed Withdrawal Request Form (“Request”) from Johnson.

Pursuant to the Commission’s Procedural Rules:

A Complainant may request to withdraw a Complaint or any part thereof at any time. A Complainant’s request to withdraw a Complaint shall be in writing and shall be signed by the Complainant or his/her attorney of record. Under such circumstances, the request may be presumed to be knowingly and voluntarily made, and the Commission may approve the request and enter an order dismissing the Complaint.



The Request, which was signed by Johnson, states that she “no longer wish[es] to pursue this Complaint.” Johnson also attests that she is making her request to withdraw voluntarily and without pressure from any organization or individual.

For the foregoing reasons, the Commission hereby grants Johnson’s request to withdraw her complaint and orders that complaint 2012E026 be DISMISSED pursuant to a VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWAL.
