ORDER

On September 18, 2013, Complainant Anne Merrill (“Merrill”) filed a complaint against Respondent TJX Homegoods for various alleged violations of the Cook County Human Rights Ordinance. The Cook County Commission on Human Rights (“Commission”) has not yet made an evidence determination with respect to this matter, but on October 23, 2013, the Commission received a fully executed Withdrawal Request Form (“Request”) from counsel for Merrill.

Pursuant to the Commission’s Procedural Rules:

A Complainant may request to withdraw a Complaint or any part thereof at any time prior to an Evidence Determination by the Commission. A Complainant’s request to withdraw a Complaint shall be in writing, shall be signed by the Complainant or his/her attorney of record, and shall be verified. If the request is knowingly and voluntarily made, the Commission shall approve the request and enter an order dismissing the Complaint.



The Request, which was signed by counsel for Merrill and notarized, states that the parties “have reached an amicable resolution to the matter[.]” Additionally, in the Request, Merrill attests, through counsel, that she is making her request to withdraw voluntarily and without pressure from any organization or individual.

For the foregoing reasons, the Commission hereby grants Merrill’s request to withdraw her complaint and orders that complaint 2013E028 be DISMISSED pursuant to a VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWAL.
