ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On September 30, 2015, Complainant Ihor Mykhashula (“Mykhashula”) filed a complaint against Respondent Schiller Park Check Exchange, Inc. (“S.P. Check Exchange”), alleging national origin discrimination in violation of the Cook County Human Rights Ordinance (“Human Rights Ordinance”). The Cook County Commission on Human Rights (“Commission”) opened an investigation and has not yet made a determination of whether there is sufficient evidence to support Mykhashula’s claim, but on April 26, 2016, the Commission received a fully executed Withdrawal Request Form (“Request”) from Mykhashula.

Pursuant to the Commission’s Procedural Rules:

A complainant may request to withdraw a complaint or any part thereof at any time. A Complainant’s request to withdraw a complaint shall be in writing and shall be signed by the Complainant or his/her attorney of record. Under such circumstances, the request may be presumed to be knowingly and voluntarily made, and the Commission may approve the request and enter an order dismissing the complaint.

CCHR Pro. R. 420.160.

The Request, which was signed by Mykhashula, states, “I no longer wish to pursue the Complaint.” Additionally, in the Request, Mykhashula attests that he is making his request to withdraw voluntarily and without pressure from any organization or individual.

For the foregoing reasons, the Commission hereby grants Mykhashula's request to withdraw his complaint and orders that Complaint No. 2015PA007 be DISMISSED pursuant to a VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWAL.
