ORDER

On or about June 2, 2014, Complainant Jeanne Stanton (“Stanton”) filed a complaint against her former employer, Respondent American Heritage Protective Services, Inc. (“American”), alleging that she was retaliated against for complaining about sexual harassment. On September 12, 2014, the Cook County Commission on Human Rights (“Commission”) granted American’s contested motion to defer this matter in favor of a proceeding involving the same parties at the Illinois Department of Human Rights (“IDHR”). The Commission’s September 12, 2014 order left the door open for either party to petition the Commission to reinstate the differed matter after the IDHR had rendered a decision. *See Stanton v. American Heritage Protective Services, Inc.*, 2014E009, *2 (CCHRC Sept. 12, 2014).

On November 14, 2014, the Commission received a fully executed Withdrawal Request Form (“Request”) from Stanton, stating that “I have reached a settlement agreement with the Respondent.” By submitting this Request, the Commission understands that Stanton wishes to permanently waive the right of reinstatement preserved by the Commission’s earlier deferral. Stanton’s Request is knowing and voluntary. *See CCHR Pro. R. 480.160.*

For the foregoing reasons, the Commission hereby grants Stanton’s request to permanently withdraw her complaint, and orders that complaint 2014E009 be DISMISSED once again, pursuant to a VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWAL, thereby extinguishing Stanton’s right to reinstatement described in the Commission’s September 12, 2014, Order.
