ORDER

On December 30, 2013, Complainant Susan Stelter (“Stelter”) filed a complaint against her former employer, Respondent Harvey Public Library District, for discrimination based on her age, in violation of the Cook County Human Rights Ordinance. The Cook County Commission on Human Rights (“Commission”) has not yet made an evidence determination with respect to this matter, but on June 4, 2014, the Commission received a fully executed Withdrawal Request Form (“Request”) from Stelter.

Pursuant to the Commission’s Procedural Rules:

A Complainant may request to withdraw a Complaint or any part thereof at any time. A Complainant’s request to withdraw a Complaint shall be in writing and shall be signed by the Complainant or his/her attorney of record. Under such circumstances, the request may be presumed to be knowingly and voluntarily made, and the Commission may approve the request and enter an order dismissing the Complaint.



The Request, which was signed by Stelter, states that she no longer wishes to pursue the Complaint because the parties have reached a settlement. Additionally, in the Request, Stelter attests that she is making her request to withdraw voluntarily and without pressure from any organization or individual.

For the foregoing reasons, the Commission hereby grants Stelter’s request to withdraw her complaint and orders that complaint 2014E002 be DISMISSED pursuant to a VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWAL.
