ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On January 12, 2016, Complainant Oksana Bukreyeva (“Bukreyeva”) filed a complaint against Respondents 4 Aces Tattoo, LLC (“4 Aces”) and Jeff Jucha (“Jucha”) (collectively, “Respondents”), alleging sexual harassment in violation of the Cook County Human Rights Ordinance (“Human Rights Ordinance”). The Cook County Commission on Human Rights (“Commission”) opened an investigation and has not yet made a determination of whether there is sufficient evidence to support Bukreyeva’s claim, but on March 9, 2016, the Commission received a fully executed Withdrawal Request Form (“Request”) from Bukreyeva.

Pursuant to the Commission’s Procedural Rules:

A complainant may request to withdraw a complaint or any part thereof at any time. A Complainant’s request to withdraw a complaint shall be in writing and shall be signed by the Complainant or his/her attorney of record. Under such circumstances, the request may be presumed to be knowingly and voluntarily made, and the Commission may approve the request and enter an order dismissing the complaint.

CCHR Pro. R. 420.160.

The Request, which was signed by Bukreyeva, states that a “settlement” was reached. Additionally, in the Request, Bukreyeva attests that she is making her request to withdraw voluntarily and without pressure from any organization or individual.

For the foregoing reasons, the Commission hereby grants Bukreyeva’s request to withdraw her complaint and orders that Complaint No. 2016E001 be DISMISSED pursuant to a VOLUNTARY WITHDRAWAL.
